
The Very Hungry Caterpillar

The Very Hungry Caterpillar


As part of our Zoom session on Wednesday we looked at 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'.

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

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



Phonics - Sticky Tricky Words

Write the letters for a handful of tricky words on small bits of card/paper.
Using double sided tape, create a sticky strip on the floor/wall (wherever it will not mark!)

The activity is to rearrange the cards to spell out the tricky words you have chosen. Once the children are certain they have the letters in the right order they stick it on the tape.

You could have a sheet of the tricky words in the activity to help them know what words they are trying to make but you could challenge them to do it without the list.

Check over them once they have stuck them on the tape and discuss any mistakes they might of made.

You can extend this by getting your child to write a sentence with each of the tricky words in. If they can put two of the words in a sentence then even better!





Phonics - Sticky Tricky Words

Write the letters for a handful of tricky words on small bits of card/paper. Using double sided tape, create a sticky strip on the floor/wall (wherever it will not mark!)

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


