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Hurworth Primary School

The PE and Sport Premium provides ring fenced money to primary school head teachers to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. The funding is currently worth £150 million per year and is provided jointly by the Department for Education, the Department of Health and the Department for Culture, Media and Sport.

Prime Minister (at the time), David Cameron announced in February 2014 that the Government have committed to funding for the Primary PE and Sport Premium to 2020.

It is for schools to decide how the PE and Sport Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the pupils within their settings. Schools however, will be accountable to outside agencies, mainly Ofsted, to show how the PE and Sport Premium has improved the quality of the PE and sport activities within the school.

Darlington School Sports Partnership SLA	£1,230	To allow pupils to take part in a wide range of competitions against other schools in Darlington. Pupils can then be selected to represent Darlington in the Tees Valley events through attending these competitions.	Pupils had the opportunity during the Autumn term and Spring 1 to take part in a range of competitions, such as football, cross country, swimming, hockey and TAG rugby. The pupils enjoyed participating and, in the majority of competitions, achieved well.
Specialist coaching sessions	MGFA package: £6,672.50	To allow the school and its teachers access to high quality teaching resources tailored to their pupils, including support from coaches to help improve skills.	During Autumn and Spring 1, pupils across the school enjoyed coaching from a range of sporting activities during PE lessons and extra-curricular activities. Being taught by specialist coaches has inspired some less active children to attend extra-curricular activities. During the National Lockdown, when school was only open to children of Key Workers, we utilised coaches from MGFA to ensure that the children in school were still getting at least one active hour throughout the day.
	After-school TAG rugby sessions: £240	To give children in different year groups the opportunity to further develop their skills in TAG rugby outside of normal school hours.	
New apparatus and additional equipment	£1,335.21	To continue to replace old equipment to create a stock of high quality, safe and varied equipment. This includes resources which need to be replenished every year, such as stickers for Sports Day.	Items have been replaced to provide more enjoyable, safer lessons for pupils and to enable the pupils to practise for inter school competitions. New apparatus and equipment have also been bought to introduce new sports, giving pupils the opportunity to experience a wide range of sporting activities.
School counselling service	£4,582.50	To ensure that children have access to support for their mental health needs. Children will be identified through discussions between teachers and parents and supported where needed.	Pupils have been supported throughout the school year where needed. The counselling service has continued via Zoom during partial school closures.
